BIOGRAPHY

Clare Byrne is a teacher, choreographer, researcher, writer, and musician. Her work in dance, music, and scholarship explores intersections of ritual, religion, transformation, and improvisation.

Byrne is a versatile and comprehensive teacher; she has taught in the dance programs at Muhlenberg College, Long Island University in Brooklyn, Manhattanville College, and was Senior Lecturer in dance in the Department of Music & Dance at the University of Vermont before leaving to gain a second graduate degree at Yale University.

In her professional career, Byrne was the artistic director of Clare Byrne Dance in New York City, and a member of Dance Tramp, a choreographic collective based in Burlington, VT. She toured the world as a founding member of Nicholas Leichter Dance, and has worked with Amy Larimer, David Neumann, Adriane Fang, Paul Besaw, Nayo Takasaki, and many other choreographers.

Byrne is a recording musician, songwriter, and bandleader. Her albums *Seed* and *Celestials* collected Vermont and New York City musicians in recording her original songs; she performs music and dance events in NYC at The Bitter End, Rockwood Music Hall, Governor's Island, and other venues in the United States and abroad with her band *The Celestials*. Her new single release "*Artemis*" debuted in 2023.

Byrne's research in African American gospel music and Black Church culture at Yale's Institute of Sacred Music produced a thesis which explored the intersection of choreographed dance ministry and ecstatic improvisation in two African Methodist Episcopal churches. This research was selected to be presented at Yale's 2nd Annual Black Sacred Arts Conference: *Ritual Transformations of Consciousness*; Byrne continues to present this scholarship at conferences and in guest lectures.

Byrne's full-evening dance projects include the *Poor Sister Clares Traveling Dancing Show*, which explores spirituality and sacrament; *Rounds: The First Last Dance, The Last First Dance*, the online improvisation blog *Weekly Rites. Pilgrimage*, a duet with Ara Fitzgerald, and *White Witch*, explores sacred and cultural constructions of feminine images. *To the Tree*, and *Letter to the Church* are site-specific works created and performed in Union Theological Seminary's chapels. *Kneelings I, II, and III* are posepoems in the simple gesture of kneeling on streets and parks of New York City and Vermont. Byrne created new choreography to the score of Aaron Copland's *Appalachian Spring* for the Burlington Chamber Orchestra.

Byrne has received awards and residences through Yale University, White Oak Residency, Jerome Robbins Fellowship and the Bogliasco Foundation, Joyce SoHo, The Dragon's Egg in Ledyard, CT, Bessie Schönberg Residency at The Yard, Meet the Composer, Mondo Cane commission through Dixon Place, NYC, selection and awards at The New York International Fringe Festival, and a Brooklyn Arts Exchange Space Grant. Her work has been presented at Danspace at St. Mark's Church, Dance New Amsterdam, Joe's Pub, The Flea Theater, Symphony Space, The Flynn Theater in Burlington, VT, and many other venues in New York City, around the country, and internationally. Her work has been reviewed/previewed multiple times in *The New York Times, Village Voice, New Yorker, Dance Insider, Backstage, TimeOut NY*, Eva Yaa Asantewaa/*InfiniteBody*, and *Seven Days* in Burlington, VT.
